#### LEST WE FORGET...NOVEMBER 11TH

Which was once called **Armistice Day** and then transitioned to a more inclusive Memorial Day. Since its origins were from World War I, I was curious if the holiday was also celebrated in Italy. I was surprised to find out that it is, and it is celebrated on November 4th rather than the 11th because November 4th was the day the Austria-Hungary Empire declared an armistice with Italy and surrendered after the Battle of Vittorio Veneto. It also helped expedite the collapse of the Western front and the final armistice of November 11th. In Italy it is called Italian National Unity and Armed Forces Day.

The consequences of the surrender and the collapse of the Austria-Hungary Empire resulted in a final push for a unified Italy, that lasted until the defeat of Italy after World War II. So much has been written about those horrific times that there is not much more to say in a couple of paragraphs in this article to do any justice to the subject. Still, I have never visited a town or village in Italy where I did not see a monument to the fallen of World War I. Some of our readers may recall several years ago, that we had a IAHF special program, based upon our members recollection of family stories pertaining to the 100th anniversary of the end of the so-called "Great War", which in truth, never ended, just smoldered and came back with a vengeance in the form of World War II,

It is one of those coincidences too, that November's regional lunch will be exploring the Veneto, a region where so much of this tragic history played out. If you are curious about that special part of Italian history, remember our library has quite an extensive selection of books relate to this historical period.

### IAHF to Visit Total (Italian) Wine and More

A holiday special is being planned for Wednesday, December 3rd, at Total Wines, 5170 Stevens Creek Boulevard. It will be a tasting of Italian wines. The time will be from 6:30 to 8:00. We will be sampling about 7 or 8 regional wines from the North to the South that are moderately priced, just in time for some great holiday gifts and menu planning.



The Total Wine concept is quite innovative and offers an amazing selection of both varietal and geographic wines from around the world. Naturally, we will be exploring Italian varietals.

In planning for this event with store manager Tina Nguyen, I have already done my own explorations and got reacquainted with some old favorites! It is difficult to have some of these wines at your fingertip. My favorite wine shop used to be Beltramo's in Menlo Park, which is sadly no longer there. Filling the gap for me is Total Wines. There are a couple of outlets in the area and the Stevens Creek store is centrally located in proximity to Lawrence Expressway with good parking.

Total Wine has at their facility a Seminar Room that sits approximately 40 guests. The presenters are very knowledgeable about their product, and Total Wines even has a sommelier associated with the store. The cost of the event is \$25 a person, which also includes some antipasti and breads to go along with the tasting. You are also able to purchase the wines sampled. Browse the store, and chat with the lecturer about a favorite wine or gift suggestion.

Purchase your ticket <u>online</u> for this event by December 2, subject to slots available. Since classroom space is limited, only those who have a confirmed pre-paid reservation will be able to attend the seminar. To hold a place, contact the IAHF or go online to make a reservation.

For 2026, we are planning some all-inclusive dinners and wine pairings at the IAHF. To be announced next year.





## IL PRANZO REGIONALE--IL VENETO

The IAHF will explore the famed Veneto at November's regional lunch, on Thursday, Nov 20th at noon. One tends to think of the Veneto in terms of, La Serenissima, Venezia....but that is just one province in the region. The other provinces include Belluno, Treviso, Vincenza, Verona, Padua and Rovigo. Several of our members' heritage come from those provinces.



The meal will begin with assorted appetizers called *cicchetti*.

Followed by a winter green salad with radicchio, *Risi e Bisi*, in honor of St Mark's Day, the Patron Saint of Venezia and, a Venetian style casseroled chicken - *Polastio in Tecia*.



One of the classic Italian desserts, Tiramisu, is from the Treviso area. Tiramisu is so common these days that we are deferring that selection in favor of one of our goals to explore some of the more authentic home style fare. For dessert a sampling of assorted *Bussola* (regional cookie) served with an eggnog style liqueur.

As we research into the cuisine, it is obvious, with the culinary diversity of the seven provinces, we will linger awhile and pick up our travels through il Veneto at our next regional lunch. A word too about the regional lunches, the menu planning may have to include some last-minute substitutes because some of the regional selections are not always available or the price fluctuation exorbitant. What always helps in menu planning is early registration for the Regional Lunch. We even order some ingredients from Italy so it becomes a fixed amount to serve.

In addition, we want to encourage our members, particularly our newer members, to consider sharing your regional heritage at one of the events. We have a great culinary team to help, and one of the goals of this program is to highlight more of the traditional cuisines as reflected in the home fare. To do this we need your knowledge and help, so we are always looking for new and adventurous "chefs". Just give me a call at the IAHF to talk about a menu idea. We also have informal discussions about the region among those in attendance after the lunch, and always fun surprises.

As we go to press, we are hoping to have some singers from San Jose State visiting and maybe even sing an aria or two! **Vediamo**!



The Invention of Sicily

By Jamie Mackay

The Invention of Sicily, A
Mediterranean History by
Jamie Mackay is a delightful
march through two
thousand years of Sicilian
history. The chapters peel
away like the layers of an
onion. And some of them
might well bring tears to

your eyes, such is the harshness of what the islanders have had to endure.

This is a non-fiction history of Sicily. So, the reader's level of enjoyment will depend on his or her willingness to be immersed in a substantial amount of detail. The narrative is smooth and friendly but packed with amazing information. Author Mackay has clearly done a thorough quantity of research, and his bibliography shows it!

The Invention of Sicily is divided into two parts. Part One, Utopian Fragments brings the reader from 800 BC to 1800 AD. We travel through the magnificent Magna Greca with its wondrous early development on the island while blending with the indigenous tribes who descended from early sea-faring people like the Phoenicians. The narrative demonstrates how this established Greek culture eventually melded into the sphere of Rome and ultimately became latinized, but never fully.

The majesty of this book is that the author demonstrates the contributions of each dominating culture without prejudice. Every empire recognized the important position of Sicily as the crossroads of the Mediterranean. From Roman to Byzantine to Arab... all leaving their footprints in architecture, art, language and cuisine. Arab rule was 200 years, and it was fascinating to learn how

many Sicilian place names are Arabic in origin. Then we head into the Norman conquest with its lovely architecture and organized government and tolerance of diverse cultures. After the Normans things get tricky on the island. Everyone wanted it... the Spanish, the Austrians, and the Norman French were struggling to keep control. Alas, all this struggle and military presence simply meant poverty for the citizens. Social reforms fell to the wayside, but the vibrant traditions of its multi-cultural inhabitants remained.

Part Two, The Hypocrisies of Nationalism begins after the Renaissance. We are introduced to outstanding Sicilian writers and artists; but there is never the flowering of culture in Sicily as occurred in the North. Sicily was also hit hard by the Inquisition and saw the exodus of thousands of its treasured Jewish and Muslim citizenry. We are then brought through the many years of Spanish Bourbon overlordship and on to Garibaldi. We learn that the unification was, effectively, the "colonization" of the South by the North. Author Mackay brings us through WW I and he presents Mussolini's rise unapologetically. He finally deals with the Mafia and his insights are thoughtful and realistic.

In his final chapter, Author Mackay leaves us with Sicily addressing an enormous refugee crisis. Thousands upon thousands of people from Africa and the Middle East seeking refuge from war and famine are converging on the island. The numbers boggle the mind.

The Invention of Sicily is both enjoyable and exceptionally edifying. The one thing that would have made it more satisfying is visual imagery. I kept my phone next to me as I read so I could google and see paintings, monuments and architectural achievements as they are mentioned. Kudos to Author MacKay for this enormous body of research presented in a smooth, readable narrative

# Italian Corner

Let's look at how we say **some** or **a little bit** in Italian. *Di, alcuni, qualche* and *un po` di* all translate as 'some'.

- 1. Di in all its forms is used with plural nouns or with nouns that cannot be counted.
  - **2. Alcuni/e** is always used with a plural count nouns.
  - **3. Qualche** is always followed by a singular count noun.
    - **4. Un po` di** always means 'a little bit of' something.
- 1.Compriamo dei libri. / Let's buy some books. Invitiamo degli amici. / Let's invite some friends.
  2. Laviamo alcune bottiglie. / Let's wash some bottles. Invitiamo alcune amiche. / Let's invite some friends. (female)
  - 3. Abbiamo qualche pomodoro nella cucina. / We have some tomatoes in the kitchen.
  - 4. Desidero un po` di pane. / I would like some bread (just a little bread, and no article on the noun).

Nouns that cannot be counted are also called indivisible nouns. Some examples are: *Pane, carne, caffe*`, *latte, minestra*. Use the partitive *Di* with all of these.

Once again, we are going to do a Christmas gift drive for the Family Giving Tree. We have a Christmas tree at the IAHF with 50 cards on it. Each card has a person's name on it, their approximate age, and the gift they are requesting. There is a second gift listed in case the first one is unavailable.



The retail value of the gift should be between \$25 and \$50. Monetary donations, either cash or check, are certainly welcome, as are gift cards, particularly to stores like Target, Safeway, etc.

When you buy a gift, it is very important that you tape the Family Giving Tree card onto the package. You do not gift wrap the package. They also request that you add a toothbrush as it helps to encourage good habits. **All gifts must be brought to IAHF by December 3** so that I can get them to the warehouse by December 4.

There will be a big box to put gifts in. Stanley has always been extremely helpful in letting people pick up cards or deliver gifts even when there is no function going on as long as the IAHF is open, Tuesdays through Fridays, 10 to 4.

All these recipients are needy people. They have been carefully screened, and they are all clients of social service agencies. Your gift will truly go to make someone's Christmas happy who might not have received anything otherwise.


