FEBRUARY REGIONAL LUNCH "PRANZO REGIONALE" -- IL VENETO-- "BIS!"

Our "Pranzo Regionale" picks up on Thursday, February 19th, where we left off in 2025, exploring the Veneto. As noted in previous articles, there are seven provinces that compose the region known as the Veneto. They are a large and diverse part of Northeastern Italy and include quite a few major towns and traditions. Because of Venice's fame in world history, parts of the region are overlooked, yet the reality is these provinces make up the backbone of the region. This is in many ways comparable to Napoli, and the areas around Campagna as well as other parts of Italy where popular cities dominate the attention of the region. It's comparable too, when I travel, and trying to explain where San Jose is, and I have to say, "it's by San Francisco!"

Also, a related and interesting piece of USA history, the first Italian flag flown in North America was the Venetian Flag in 1497. It was raised along with the British Flag, by the Venetian navigator, Giovanni Caboto aka John Cabot who sailed for England during the age of European explorations. So, we will continue our culinary explorations in Giovanni's memory as follows:

### The Pietro "Pete" Panto Italian Diaspora Labor Dissertation Fellowship



This year marks the second of six funded years of the Panto Fellowship prize. The fellowship is for graduate students who are writing their dissertation on any topic involving Italian emigrant and/or Italian ethnic labor and/or working-class life either in the United States or in the wider Italian diaspora.

Submissions may come from all relevant fields of study in the social sciences and humanities, including, but not limited to, history, literary studies, film studies, gender studies, and political science. The fellowship will run for six years with one award given each year. The fellowship award

is \$1,000 US per year.

The fellowship is named after dockworker and labor activist Pietro "Pete" Panto (1910–1939), who was murdered for leading rank-and-file stevedores in a struggle for safe and democratic working conditions on the Brooklyn waterfront, which had long been in the grip of mobsters and corrupt elements in the union.

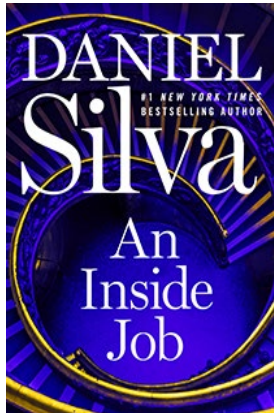

## An Inside Job

By Daniel Silva

An Inside Job by Daniel Silva tells the story of Gabriel Allon, a former high level Mossad spy who has retired and is now practicing his original profession as fine art restorer. Silva is a very prolific writer, having authored 28 novels.

Gabriel Allon belongs to a series. It is not necessary, however, to read the books in order, each stands strongly alone.

This book is appropriate for this column because it takes place entirely in Venice and Rome. The story involves the theft of an important masterpiece from the Vatican museum. The story is somewhat convoluted,

Gabriel Allon, for lack of a better description, is a superhero. On top of being a loving father, faithful husband and revered retired spy, he's unforgettably handsome, and an ace in everything he does. His arrows and bullets hit the bullseye, he can produce an undetectable Rembrandt replica, he somehow sat in on the Conclave during the election of the new Pope, and the new Pope happens to be his best friend giving Allon unrestricted access to the papal residence. It's a lot. Nevertheless, the story clips along offering twists and turns at a lively pace.

An Inside Job will keep you entertained and you will enjoy spending time with the Pope in non-formal situations.

November Regional Luncheon - Polastro In Tecia

This is a delicious chicken stew, or casserole timely for the winter months and highlights many of the special flavors from the Veneto region. The recipe modified a bit, came from a favorite cookbook, Italian Regional Cooking by Ada Boni. Note - when we prepare meals for the regional lunches, we check out many source recipes and personal recollections with our IAHF members who are from the region, so I will be presenting the modified recipe. The dish serves 5 to 6 people. When we prepared the dish it was for 80 people.



Ingredients

Chicken: 3 lb. diced. You can use a cut up whole chicken or boneless pieces. For the Regional Lunch I used skinned and boneless chicken breast and thighs. (I rarely use any sort of boned meats for a large group).

1 1/4 Tsp olive oil
4 Tbs butter
1 diced or sliced onion
1 large carrot diced
1 stalk of celery diced
1/2 cup of dry white wine
10 oz Italian peeled tomatoes (for this dish I substituted pureed tomatoes)
2 cloves (I used ground clove powder)
pinch of cinnamon and sage
1 lb. fresh button mushrooms

Instructions for Polastro In Tecia

Begin by making a "soffritto" by sautéing the onions, carrots and celery over medium heat with oil and butter until slightly wilted (about 5 minutes or so). Add chicken pieces and brown lightly, which seals in the meat.

Then add the wine, tomato sauce and season to taste with salt, black pepper, cloves and cinnamon. I used clove powder and ground cinnamon. I also added sage, not in the original recipe. Cover and let simmer over medium heat for 45 minutes until chicken done. This was the first time I used cinnamon and cloves in a chicken dish so, I was conservative with its application. Chris Hudson, an IAHF member, noted she recalled a more pronounced cinnamon taste when her family made the dish so that becomes a matter of taste. The herbs must blend in the casserole. Interesting too, in putting the powdered cloves sage and cinnamon, into the mixture, provided a distinctly brown hue to the dish and adds a certain richness to the flavor.

Finally put the diced mushroom into the casserole, and continue cooking on medium heat, uncovered, for about 20 minutes. The mushrooms provide additional liquid. In a survey of the recipes, it is served as a soupy casserole rather than a drier dish. You could add additional chicken broth, or wine and tomato sauce to get to the consistency you prefer. It's also a dish I will be replicating at home soon! The herbs from the Venetian spice trade were very much evident as the flavors and aromas filled the room in cooking. You can serve with rice, or good French bread, I am sure it will taste better the next day when the flavors all blend, but there were no leftovers to give it a try!

## Zaleti

Zaleti are traditional, diamond-shaped Venetian cookies. Select Zaleti to watch a YouTube video of Julia Child and Chef Nick Malgieri bake these cookies.

### Ingredients

1 cup Zante currants in 2 Tbsp. warm water or grappa or brandy, etc.

Dry ingredients:

1 cup flour  
1 cup polenta/cornmeal  
1/3 cup sugar  
1/4 tsp salt  
1 tsp baking powder

Wet ingredients:

1 egg plus 1 egg yolk  
1 tsp vanilla  
Zest of 1 lemon

1 stick cold butter

### Instructions

Preheat oven to 350 degrees

1. Presoak currants for 20-30 minutes
2. Add all the dry ingredients into a large bowl, then whisk together.
3. Add all the wet ingredients into a separate bowl, then whisk together..
4. Cut butter into dry ingredients and work it with your hands. Then mix in currants.
5. Make a well, add wet ingredients, mix with hands until the mixture comes together.

Once mixed, turn onto lightly floured surface and mix/knead to bring together.

Divide in half or thirds and roll into 12-14" long logs then flatten top.

Cut on diagonal and put on parchment paper lined baking sheet, cut side up.

Bake for about 15 minutes.

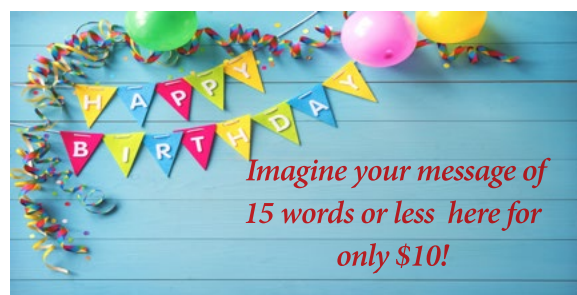
