This year our Festa takes on added significance because we are also part of world wide celebrations among Italian American communities, acknowledging the 150th anniversary


of Italian Unity. We have run several IAHF articles about the event, its history and significance. In a very real sense, our Festa exemplifies the

#### HOW TO GET THERE

#### Caltrain

Caltrain provides train service from Diridon Station going north to the Peninsula and San Francisco, and south to Gilroy. Please note that the last northbound train departs Diridon Station at 10:30 pm on Monday-Saturday and at 9:00 pm on Sundays.

#### Light Rails

The VTA Vasona Light Rail also serves the HP Pavilion in San Jose with a light rail station near Diridon Station and on San Fernando Street at Delmas Avenue.

The Vasona Light Rail service connects Campbell to HP Pavilion in San Jose and beyond to downtown, north to Mountain View, and south to Santa Teresa. Please check http://www.vta.org/ for full VTA light rail schedules.

In addition to Caltrain, VTA (Valley Transit Authority) buses also services Diridon Station.

#### PARKING

There are over 6,000 parking spaces located within a ½ mile radius of the HP Pavilion at San Jose. Approximately 1,500 spaces are located on-site in the large parking lot next to the building with entry from either Santa Clara or Julian Streets. There are another 500 spaces in the lots less than one block from the building off Santa Clara Street at Autumn, Montgomery and Cahill Streets. There are many other parking lots located throughout the area, usually opening 2.5 hours prior to the scheduled start time of the event. The charge for parking ranges from \$3.50 - \$15 for most events.

## ITALIANS & THE MOB

You would have thought this title would have come from a B-rated hollywood movie, but the following incident occurred in the California State Assembly on June 20th, 2011.

Tony Zerbo sent a letter to the San Jose Mercury News about the incident, of which they declined to print. Likewise did IAHF member Chet Campenella. I am sharing the letter with you since it was also read at the IAHF June Board meeting.

If you remove the partisan politics from the issue, you get some idea of how ingrained this stereotype is, and for many Italian Americans who are professionals or even in the trades and services, you never know when the "mob card" gets played. Perhaps it's a losing battle to change perceptions on this one, given the history of the media assault on our heritage, but as I have said quite recently "If we don't do it, who will?" I don't think we can roll over and ignore these matters. Tony and Chet need to be commended for taking the time to write their letters of concern.



The final punchline in the matter was that the Assemblyman would only apologize to those Italian Americans who were not members of the Mafia! So how do you prove something like that? It's a no win game, save to express your concerns when these slurs, sometimes very unconscious, surface. (As we go to press with this story Assemblyman Wagner did eventually issue a message of apology). Even so, this was an underreported news item, and highlights how little our Italian American Experience is deemed news worthy by mainstream media. It is also why it's very important to stay connected to your own sources. Tony's letter is noted as follows:

#### Letter to the Editor -- Subject: California State Assemblyman Stereotypes All Italians as Mafia Members

In yesterday's California State Assembly's floor debates on eliminating Redevelopment Agencies (FDA's), Assemblyman, Don Wagner, (R), Irvine, made racial slurring remarks against those who objected to passing this bill, "as a Tony Soprano shake down or else sort of legislation", and inferring by his remarks that all Italians are members of the Mafia. That caused Anthony Portantino, (D), L.A. County, to object to Wagner's prejudged remarks, and asked Wagner to make an apology to all the Italian-Americans in California...Wagner's response was that "he would only do that for the Italians who are not members of the Mafia", which brought Portantino's colleagues to his defense, resulting in a brawl of pushing and shoving. There is no place in our State Assembly for this type of racial discrimination. -- *Tony Zerbo*




