where people had the opportunity to explore their roots, and get some of the tools and information to take their personal quests to the next level. We are beginning to recruit a new group of IAHF members to do just that in the forthcoming months as we reconstitute our library collection, do more online computer activities, and update our regional photo collection. If you wish more information about these activities contact Pam Lyons at the IAHF.

Every year our entertainment gets even better, and when you experience the activities, you really can get swept away into not making a decision as to what to do next. I had friends who spent 5 or 6 hours at the Festa and we never connected just because of the activities. Consider the music at the Roma Stage alone: The Fratello Marionettes, followed by a first time ever visit from Bella Napoli, Alfredo Imparato, who is a Neopolitian Street Singer, followed by Italica, an Italian American pop band from Sebastopol, followed by an international sensation, ALFIO from Austraila via NYC, capped by a street dance featuring The Don Giovannis.

This year our culinary staged partnered up with the International Culinary Center from Campbell, California. Their chefs shared some very special culinary gems, such as homemade ravioli and pasta shaping, corn and ricotta gnudi (a type of gnocchi), along with traditional gnocchi, and a pasta rolling contest. Joining the program were 3 local restaurants, sharing some of their specialties; George Noble, New York Trattoria, shared Pasta Primavera; Pino Spatola, Paesano's demonstrated Penne alla Vodka; and Al Vallorz, Tony and Alba's demonstrated sun cooked tomato pasta sauce. In between all that we managed our famous grape stomping contest sponsored by Guglielmo Winery located at the Gugleilmo Stage along with a special photo op with the classic "I Love Lucy" sit com grape stomping scene. Sunday also saw a special show from our Italian daycare school, La Piccola Scuola nel Parco, i bambini, della scuola Sabatino di San Jose in Little Italy.

Our opening ceremonies were also very special with dignitaries from throughout the city, county and region attendees included our own Consul General Mauro Battocchi, from San Francisco, highlighting the importance of the Year of Italian Culture in the USA. We were also honored to have Paolo Romano from the Patrons of Italian Culture with us from Los Angeles, representing the organizations of the Southland. Representing the emerging Little Italy was Josh De Vincenzi Melander who talked about the progress his dynamic team is making, along with honoring Frank Fiscalini with a banner in the park (congratulations Frank!). A "grazie" to Cathy De Maria, our opening ceremony chairperson, who for many years has made this such an key part of our Festa cultural activities.

In addition, we had our traditional bocce, wonderful vendors, highlighted by a special article in the San Jose Mercury News by Joe Rodriguez about Carla Almanza-deQuant and her quest to share the traditional Venetian masks art form with today's world. When I went by the Gioia Co. booth a line had form to secure the masks before the booth was open. They are stunning creations, but that was just one art booth, of which we had so many, along with the food booths that also support many other Italian American organizations. Space does not permit me to go into the details. You had to be at the event to experience the Festa. A special thanks to our dynamic chairperson Joe Rizzi, who put an amazing team together that fielded approximately 250 volunteers, along with our sponsors both from our membership and the community to make this a very special community based effort. Likewise an acknowledgment to Nancy Morreale for all her work in a multitude of activities in addition to mobilizing our Festa volunteers. Commitment and networking were the two operative words, which helped us add our "brand" to the cultural cornerstone of Italian heritage in the South Bay and beyond.

I would like to say we can now take a good rest, but not so, given the realities of a Festa of this scale. Other IAHF programs need attention, and operating pretty much as a volunteer based organization is a routine that requires daily attention. We were and are gratified to have recruited many new members to the IAHF this year, and I want to personally welcome them to the foundation. We are excited to have you aboard! A special thanks to those who staffed the membership booth, for that is truly our lifeblood and support so that this " field of dreams" will continue!

new, multimedia web site, MadelntoAmerica.org, featuring immigration stories. We know that the Italian-American community has a great presence in the Bay Area and we'd love to see some of those immigration stories on the website.

Our goal is to create a story exchange where families throughout the Silicon Valley connect to their own immigration experience - whenever that occurred and in so doing, eliminate some of the "us/them" perspective about who is an immigrant.

Please consider posting a brief write-up about a relative of yours who left everything behind in Italy and started a new life in the U.S. A story is just a few paragraphs and hopefully a photo that you can upload of your immigrant relative. There's an easy to follow form on the site for submitting your story. It could be as simple as copying seven questions I've listd below and writing an answer underneath each one. Or feel free to write extemporaneously. Don't feel you need to answer all the questions, or that your relative had to end up in California. If you need help getting a photo scanned, just let me know.

I think you'll also find some very compelling stories that have already been posted and encourage you to leave a comment on any that really touch you. You can search the stories through tag words or a number of different filters on the site.

This project is made possible by a grant from the Immigrant Integration initiative of the Silicon Valley Community Foundation.

Here are the questions you can use as a template for your story:

- 1. Where did he/she come from?
- 2. What did they do in Italy?
- 3. When did they come to the U.S.
- 4. Why did they leave Italy?
- 5. Where did they start out in the U.S.?
- 6. What kind of work did they find?

7. Are there any particular experiences or memories about those early years in the U.S. that left an impression on you?

Both played active rolls in the life of the IAHF, in addition to being very solid, friendly and supportive individuals in a number of ways. Both Corrado and Tony were actively involved in the community, along with their life time spouses, Zina and Kay. Each had very enriching lives in their own right, but we at the IAHF were doubly blessed by their talents, competency and friendships, so it is also a very personal loss to many of us who had the good fortune to work with them.

About Conrad:

Corrado was born in Rome on August 31, 1936 and died July 24th 2013. He lived through the horrors of World War II, and in the 1950's migrated to Canada. It was there that he met his wife to Vincenzina (Zina). While in be. Montreal he went to Concordia University with a Masters at McGill University in engineering. In 1979 he moved to San Jose, working with FMC on defense systems. Upon retiring from FMC he worked as an engineering consultant, and became involved in the life of the community. Conrad Russo was appointed to the County of Santa Clara, CA USA/Province of Florence, Italy Sister County Commission, and served as a Florence Commissioner for more than fifteen years, from July 1993 through September 2008. He was an active commissioner who consistently attended meetings and served on various committees throughout his tenure. Conrad graciously and unconditionally volunteered to assist in planning and preparation of Commission's events and activities, and provided support and language interpreting services to visiting delegations from Florence. He was a staunch supporter of Italian culture in Santa Clara County, always willing to promote cultural and technology exchange. Likewise, as a member of the Italian American Heritage Foundation's Board of Directors for several years, Conrad helped coordinate and chair for the IAHF the annual Festa della Repubblica Italiana for many years. Corrado and his wife Zina, were honorary chairs of the Festa della Repubblica, representing the IAHF for the last two years. They have been very active in the life of the IAHF in numerous events, and shared many stories of growing up in pre and post World War II Roma. Corrado passed away July 24, 2013, and leaves many family and friends in three countries, Italy, Canada, and the USA, a truly international person, fluent in English, Italian and French.


