

Joe Rizzi and a stellar team of volunteers has basically worked throughout the year, soon to reach Festa time. We have a great, and exciting venue lined up of artisans, entertainers and special events. It is certainly a not to be missed experience. We still are welcoming of volunteers. In fact as I have said many times, volunteers are the life blood of our organization and truly contribute to the success of our organization.

In Cucina

Chocolate Zucchini Cake

So your looking at another bountiful harvest of zucchini, you have your share list of friends and family and now you're looking for a new recipe. Why not try this yummy chocolate cake but don't give away the secret ingredient, zucchini. Watch their faces light up as they take that first bite.

Prep Time: 15 Minutes
Cook Time: 50 Minutes
Ready In: 1 Hour 5 Minutes

Servings: 24

This is a moist fudgy type cake. Sweet but not extremely sweet and makes good use of zucchini! You can frost it with chocolate frosting or cream cheese icing.

Ingredients:

2 cups all-purpose flour

2 cups white sugar

3/4 cup unsweetened cocoa pow-

der

2 teaspoons baking soda

1 teaspoon baking powder

1/2 teaspoon salt

1 teaspoon ground cinnamon

4 eggs

1 1/2 cups vegetable oil

3 cups grated zucchini

3/4 cup chopped walnuts

Directions:



Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Grease and flour a 9x13 inch baking pan.

In a medium bowl, stir together the flour, sugar, cocoa, baking soda, baking powder, salt and cinnamon. Add the eggs and oil, mix well. Fold in the nuts and zucchini until they are evenly distributed. Pour into the prepared pan.

Bake for 50 to 60 minutes in the preheated oven, until a knife inserted into the center comes out clean. Cool cake completely before finishing with your favorite frosting.

This year was no different from all the previous years when it came to selecting the recipients of the 2013 scholarships. Every submission was worthy but in the end only nine scholarships were awarded.



Viva L'Italia, a gala evening benefit

In honor of the Year of the Italian Culture in the US and Giuseppe Verdi's Bicentennial Celebrations on June 15th, Ken Borelli and fellow board members, Chris Hudson, Cleo Logan and Tony Zerbo attended "Viva L'Italia" at the Fairmont Hotel in San Francisco. The Gala was a fundraiser to bring the Teatro di San Carlo, Napoli orchestra and chorus to San Francisco to unite them with the San Francisco Opera to perform Verdi Requiem at the War Memorial Opera House on October 25, 2013.

The event was a who's who of San Francisco's most prominent Italians and Italian Americans. In attendance were the Hon. Luigi de Magistris Mayor of the City of Napoli and President of Teatro di

Festa Della Repubblica Italiana

The IAHF, Office of the Honorary Vice Consul General of Italy and Santa Clara County Board of Supervisors, under the Offices of Supervisor Dave Cortese, did the honors this year in celebrating the 67th anniversary of the founding of the Italian Republic. As our local tradition has evolved we held a flag raising and the SCC Center at 11:00 am followed by a lunch at the IAHF. The Festa Della Repubblica honors the vote or election that established Italy as a parliamentary republic and abolished the monarchy. It also recalls a very turbulent time in Italian and world history that was part of the turbulent aftermath of the horrific World War II. So much of modern Italy is predicated upon this historic period. In many ways we as Italian Americans know very little about the consequences of this epoch for Italy, but likewise as a community the Italian Americans were also undergoing major changes in terms of our relationship to the Italy of old. Along these lines the Festa della Repubblica was an opportunity to learn more about the making of modern Italy. In order to do this we turned to Professor Valerio Ferme, of the Toso Endowed Chair for Italian Studies at Santa Clara

University to be our keynote speaker and provide insight into the Parliamentary Form of government that Italy has evolved into since World War II. He did an amazing job in a very short time to provide us with a glimpse into the basics how a parliamentary system works, party coalitions and the decision making process. There is a consistent President of the Republic, however most of the key decisions are made in coalition with various political parties. It is this jockeying for power among the parties that hold the key to understanding the governmental decision making process. Questions and answers followed the talk. A film on the Mussolini Years, and the historical setting for the development of the republic followed; and it was requested that we also have an evening showing for those who could not stay or attend the noon event. That will be a project to come.

A timely thought too, to our Honorary Chairs Conrad and Zina Russo. The Russo's had been chairs for many of our past events. This year Conrad is "under the weather" and they were not able to make the activities, we all wish Conrad a speedy recovery! Likewise a special thanks to Richard Vanucci, our member at large from Castro Valley who lent us the video we played, and are planning to show again, when we can have a bit of discussion on this historical epoch. The World War II years may be fading into memory as those major participants pass on into history but the consequences of those years are still with us today, including this special celebration.
