President's Message by Ken Borelli



IF WE DON'T DO IT. WHO WILL?

That was the question I concluded with to our membership, as well as all those interested in our Italian culture and heritage, in last months article. The question ties into the twopart aspect of sustainability of our foundation and of promoting our heritage. The Festa plays an important part in this question as it relates to the general viability of our heritage within the greater Santa Clara County. Likewise, we hope to increase revenues for the IAHF, so it has a fund raiser roll, too. And, speaking of fund raising, which is never to far off from my mind these days, the Festa Committee is planning a Casino Night to augment our Festa budget. We are very appreciative of the City of San Jose's community arts grant, but the grant itself is only a part of the fiscal picture in terms of seed monies for the Festa. Casino Night, along with previous Festa benefits and member sponsorships, provides the seed monies for the initial Festa operations. In addition to the Festa, the question of the viability of our heritage is really the issue, along with "what it will take to grow with the generations?"

Our recent Festa della Repubblica on June 2 also highlighted this viability and focus, with the Flag Raising and Recog-nition Lunch at the IAHF, supported by the President of the Board of Supervisors Dave Cortese, Chairs Corrado and Zina Russo, along with many of the major Italian American organizations in the Valley. This year, as a special tribute to the 150th

Anniversary of the unification of the modern state of Italy, it was particularly gratifying to have Pasquale Esposito sing his stirring rendi-

tion of the Italian National Anthem at the Santa Clara County Government Center. I don't think I have heard it sung with such feeling and articulation. At the luncheon we also received an update on developments in the

emerging Little Italy neighborhood by Josh DeVincenzi Melan-der, and supportive words by San Jose City Councilman Pierluigi Oliverio, and our honorary Vice Counsel General Silvia Raviola. It was really great seeing old friends at the luncheon network!

We have recently sent out several event flyers as a part of our new outreach, and there really should be something for pretty much everyone at the IAHF. As noted these events serve to call attention to "Italian Americana",

and our roll in the community. Even as we gear up for the Festa, there are additional events also being planned, such as our "The Sky is the Limit Family B B Q Celebrating This Year's Scholarship Honorees" on July 17. My

The photo collection was started by Iohn and Lonnie DeVincenzi early on in our IAHF history, and was an ongoing part of John's free time at the IAHF for many years. After the hall renovation, the collection was

moved to the hall display cases where they exist today. Part of our job is to really tell our story; after all, *if we dont do it who will*? On that note I hope you join us at some of these activities, and share this information with your family, friends, and neighbors, as "Cultural Ambassadors" of our rich Italian American Heritage!


