

Important Deadline for IAHF Scholarship!





A PEEK INTO THE BOARDROOM

March 14, 2023 IAHF Board of Directors Meeting

- The meeting was called to order by President Dana Zuccarello. In attendance were: Ken Borelli, Frank DeTurris, Azie Habib, Louie Lombardo, Joe Lucito, Sharon McCray, Mary Pizzo, Stephen Ricossa, Tony Zerbo and Dana Zuccarello. Marie Bertola and Dave Perzinski participated via Zoom. After the Pledge of Allegiance, the Minutes from the February 13 meeting were approved.
- Dana shared a thank you letter from Ron Diridon for our dedication and commitment to our Italian heritage. She also asked for help with the St. Joseph's Day celebration on March 19.
- Frank provided detailed financial information regarding the status of our accounts as of February 28. Our total bank assets were \$407,059 with Year-To-Date income of \$35,267. We have available cash of \$104,517. A major portion of that cash is planned for hall improvements in 2023. \$80,000 remains earmarked for building repairs and upgrades with \$88,705 restricted to scholarships and grant requirements. The overall financial condition of the IAHF remains good.
- Ken spoke to the successful Tenth Street Whiskey tasting event that
 was attended by 35 members and their guests. Events were again
 outlined and additional information as to dates and locations, can
 be found within this Newsletter. Be sure to save the dates for the
 June 4 Bocce Tournament and June 11 Scholarship dinner.
- Plans for the FESTA are coming along. We have a new Public Relations person, Katie Marzullo and the contract with Claudette Man-

- nina for sponsorship services has been signed. The culinary and cultural booths are being combined and will share the stage, saving money and providing a more cohesive experience.
- Azie reported that there are 17 Hall rentals as of today for 2023.
 Also, during the week of March 27, the new flooring will be installed. He asked that everyone with keys to the Hall be sure to lock up and set the alarm when they vacate the building.
- Dave submitted three bids for necessary repairs and painting to the women's restroom. A motion was made, seconded and passed to hire HH Construction to complete the work for a cost not to exceed \$11,000. As of this writing, this work will be completed during the same week as the flooring installation.
- Dave further reported that we have 536 active members, 29 of whom are complimentary. After asking each board member to call former members who had not renewed so far this year we received 21 renewals.
- Ken announced that the two-year grant extension with the Santa Clara County Parks and Recreation Department has been approved.
- Mary asked that the deadline for newsletter submissions be the 20th of each month, with first proof on the 23rd. Anyone wishing to submit articles should make sure they are received in time for publication.
- There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:35
 PM. Next meeting is Tuesday, April 11 at 7 PM.

Learn Italian

They say the older you are the more difficult it is to learn a new language. Well, here is an inspiring story that refutes this belief. Let me introduce you to Jose "Joe" Gallegas (Grandpa to the family) who celebrated his 99th birthday on March 11, 2023.

Joe was born in 1924 in Alamosa, Colorado, a small town about four hours from Denver. His family is Hispanic, with a Spanish heritage. He learned English when he started school in the first grade. At that time in Colorado, Hispanics were very isolated and there were separate movie theaters, schools, and water fountains for any non-whites. Joe's mother was a homemaker and his dad worked at a printing press. He grew up doing a few jobs over the years; he had a paper route, and also used to trap muskrats to sell their pelt during the depression. Joe had three brothers and a sister. One brother is still alive, with whom he loved playing.

At age 20, Joe enlisted in the Army Air Corps (now the Air Force), and had his first experiences traveling: first to Brownsville, Texas for basic training, and then to Europe. Joe was a radio operator. The planes would transport goods, fuel for General Patton, and prisoners of

war. During the war, Joe developed a love of culture and travel and spent most of his time between England and France, even learning quite a bit of French.

When he returned home, he went to school on the GI bill and ultimately





got his Master's Degree in education, teaching first at a one-room schoolhouse and later teaching mostly in elementary schools. Joe and his wife were substitute teachers into their 80s. They were married on Christmas Eve and had four kids. They moved to California in 1970 to teach and ultimately settle in Milpitas.

This was done to prohibit the wealthy in Venice from ornately painting their gondolas, which would enable them to showcase their wealth and opulence publicly.

Another interesting design element about gondolas is that they are lopsided. They are purposely tilted to counterbalance the weight of the gondolier.

On March 2nd, the IAHF had a whiskey tasting at the 10th Street Distillery, which is our new neighbor across the street from the IAHF. The distillery moved from their 10th Street location to 442 N. 4th Street location. The CEO is Virag Saksema, a scotch whiskey aficionado who, along with Jean Coching and other staff, were our wonderful hosts. They provided a good understanding about the making of distilled spirits and why the 10 St Distillery is respected in the field. Virag, an engineer by training, studied his craft in Scotland before embarking on his start-up venture in San Jose.

The 10th Street Distillery is part of a growing trend in craft liquors. We sampled seven award winning selections, capped off by a special house cocktail called "Penicil-

lin." That special recipe is noted in their online home page. Many of the materials for their blends come from Scotland, so it is a Scotch-like whiskey. They make several blends ranging from a light Scotch malt to a smoky malt. Imported peat is used to flavor a range of blends. The 10th Street Distillery has won several competitive awards, includ-









ing recognition from Forbes, the Whiskey Advocate, and the SJ Mercury News. In 2021, they received "Best in Show" from the NY Spirits Competition, as well as Best Single Malt Whiskey for 2022. These are very competitive tastings with a national focus. The success of their craft is that it is now being sold by national distributors such as COSTCO and even locally at Eataly in Valley Fair.

If you missed this event, the tasting room is open to the public Friday and Saturday 1-6 pm.

We followed the tasting with some socializing back at the IAHF with coffee and snacks. Truthfully it was fun socializing with our group and comparing notes and taste. One interesting part of the lore is even the spelling of the word "whisky," which can also be with an "e" or whiskey. One is an Irish

spelling, and one is a Scottish spelling. I think we in the USA have formally adopted the Irish spelling. Now I am curious about how the Canadians spell it. According to Websters Dictionary, Brits, Scots, and Canadians favor whisky! The bottom line is it all tastes very good.



Farmers and Nobles

by Robert Sorrentino ~

Farmers and Nobles is a prime example of what can be accomplished in the field of genealogical research. Author Robert Sorrentino, a retired banker and successful podcaster, shows us how it is done. If you are interested in tracing your genealogy this is a book for you.

The beginning of Mr. Sorrentino's quest was the serendipitous discovery

of a picture postcard sent from Italy to his grandfather in the early 1900's. One question about the photo led to another and before long his quest became an obsession. He refers to it as a "calling."

Bringing our ancestors out of the past and into the present is a way of honoring them. Through marriage and birth records Mr. Sorrentino was able to trace his ancestry back through hundreds of years. He traced two of his family lines, one side of the family finds its roots in the land, the other in nobility. Thus, the title of the book.

Perhaps the most important chapter in the book is toward the end. Research Primer explains many of the tools and methods he used to find these amazing records. He also includes photos from the archives so you can see what you are getting in to. With patience and persistence, Mr. Sorrentino found his way to helpful resources which he names specifically in this chapter. Among them are: Antenati, Angelfire, trecanni.it, Libro di Oro Mediterranean, familysearch.org, Bella Italia Genealogy and more.

Of particular excitement for the author is his guided Grand Rooting Trip. With a guide he travelled throughout Italy visiting his roots, his ancestral places, and meeting long-lost relatives. A perfect culmination of years of genealogical research...a well-spent retirement!

Even if you are not into genealogy this book is a treat and a worth-while read. Since Author Sorrentino traces his noble line back to numerous famous ruling houses of Italy, he provides us with historical sketches refreshing our knowledge of Italy's long and complex history. For those interested in pursuing your genealogy, Author Sorrentino recommends www.italiangeneology.com.

- 3. Proprio can actually mean own.
 - Ognuno deve prendere il proprio. Everyone should take their own.
 - Lavoro in proprio. I work on my own (independently).
- 4. Proprio can also mean exactly.
 - Proprio cosi. Exactly like that.
- 5. Proprio can indicate truly or really.
 - Mi fa proprio piacere incontrarti! A real pleasure to meet you!
 - Era proprio lui! It was really him!
 - Non mi piace proprio! I really do not like it!
- 6. Proprio can also mean just.
 - L'ho visto proprio oggi. I saw him just today.

At approximately 600 pages, it includes 86 new stories of local Italian heritage, family legacies, and much love being shared by its creators. It's available for check out now!


Videos of past IAHF events online

In addition, because the background matches other unlabeled photos in our collection, I will be able to add badly needed essential information to several mystery photos. Daylight
Savings Time:
Keeping in
Touch with
ITALY



Italy has Daylight Savings Time, but it is not the same as here in the United States. The effective dates of Daylight Savings Time are the same for all countries within the European Union, which includes Italy, France, Spain, Germany and Poland among others. In Europe, the clocks "spring forward" on the last Sunday of March and then "fall back" to Standard Time on the last Sunday of October.

This contrasts with the rules here in the United States where we spring forward on the second Sunday in March and fall back to Standard Time on the first Sunday in November. So for the last two weeks in March and the first week of November each year, Italy is only 8 hours ahead of the U.S. West Coast rather than the usual 9 hours. This is something to keep in mind if you are calling friends and family.






