THE GIFT OF HERITAGE!





WASHINGTON, D.C. – November 1, 2012 — Scholarships will be available to college students through the National Italian American Foundation (NIAF) for the 2013-2014 academic year. The Foundation has awarded millions of dollars in scholarships and cultural grants since its inception in 1976.

NIAF celebrates its 37th anniversary this year. Since NIAF's inception, the scholarship program has grown from four scholarships of \$250 each to dozens of annual scholarships ranging in value from \$2,000 to \$10,000 each in the humanities, medicine, engineering, business, music, Italian language and culture, and other specialized fields. Last year, the average scholarship to students in the United States was worth more than \$3,000.

1) Do you prefer a day class, to start at 11:00 am, or an evening class starting at 6:00 pm? The classes will be on Tuesdays.


