Anthony Quartuccio; from LA the voice of Monreale, Sicily, Joe D'Angelo; and steel guitarist Bobby Black, along with Richard Shon and the Saddle Cats. Shorty Joe, aka Giuseppi Quartuccio, was born in Monreale, Sicily, and raised in San Jose. His tale as an immigrant child, listening to the music of the times on his radio, and then learning to play that music, and then perwith forming the greats Country/Western, is the stuff of musical fables, and is as American as apple pie and pizza! There is a separate flyer that highlights this event but it underscores the vitality of our immigrant family roots and legacy. And, to borrow from an observation made by former Assemblyman Dominic Cortese, during the unveiling of the banners in Little Italy last month..."The Italian American experience did not end with the migration from Italy to *l'America*, it just began"...and Shorty Joe's life time achievements reaffirms that observation.

And for those with a more classical bent, there will be a chamber music group from Venice visiting San Jose in November, and we hope to have some group seating made available. In a separate

This, too, is a must see series of events for those interested in the art and culture of the region known as *Il Veneto*. I also want to put in a plug for your support of the IAHF Board and to consider

As many of your know in April and May, the IAHF hosted a regional forum on the internment of Italian Americans during World War II. The event was co-hosted by the Western Regional Chapter of the American Italian Historical Association. Several Congress people, State legislators, members of our local governmental agencies, prominent Italian American groups were also present at the venue. Participating at the event were family members of those who were directly impacted by thi difficult time. This is a major part of Italian American History that is still not understood.

With the goal of shedding some light on the "war years" the seminar was developed along with a month long exibit at the Martin Luther King San Jose Main Library. We are now fortunate to have the workshop

proceedings on DVD. It was video taped by George Geevargis of Niramco Enterprises Inc. from San Francisco, Ca. The video tape needs some editing, and we would like to make this important and historical document available to you, I need to know by way of a call or email to the IAHF of your interest in having a copy of the meeting/focus group.
